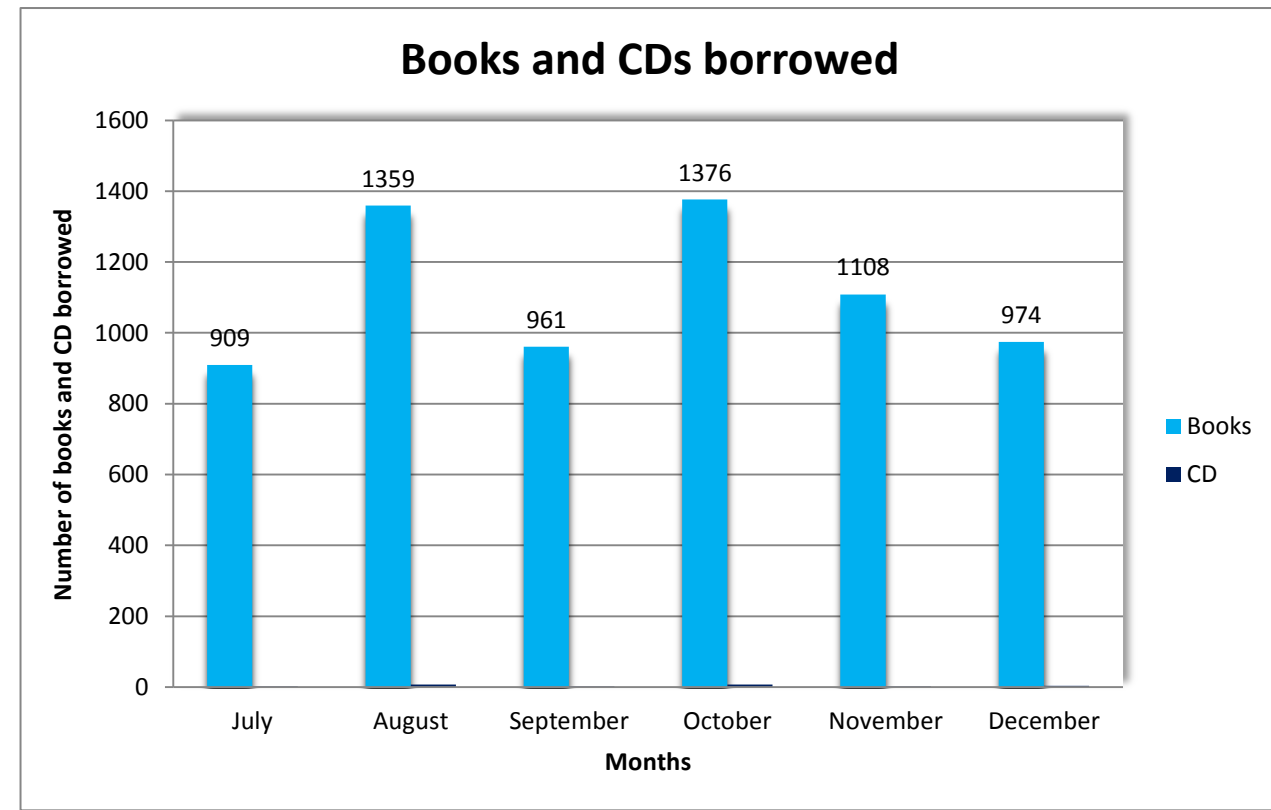
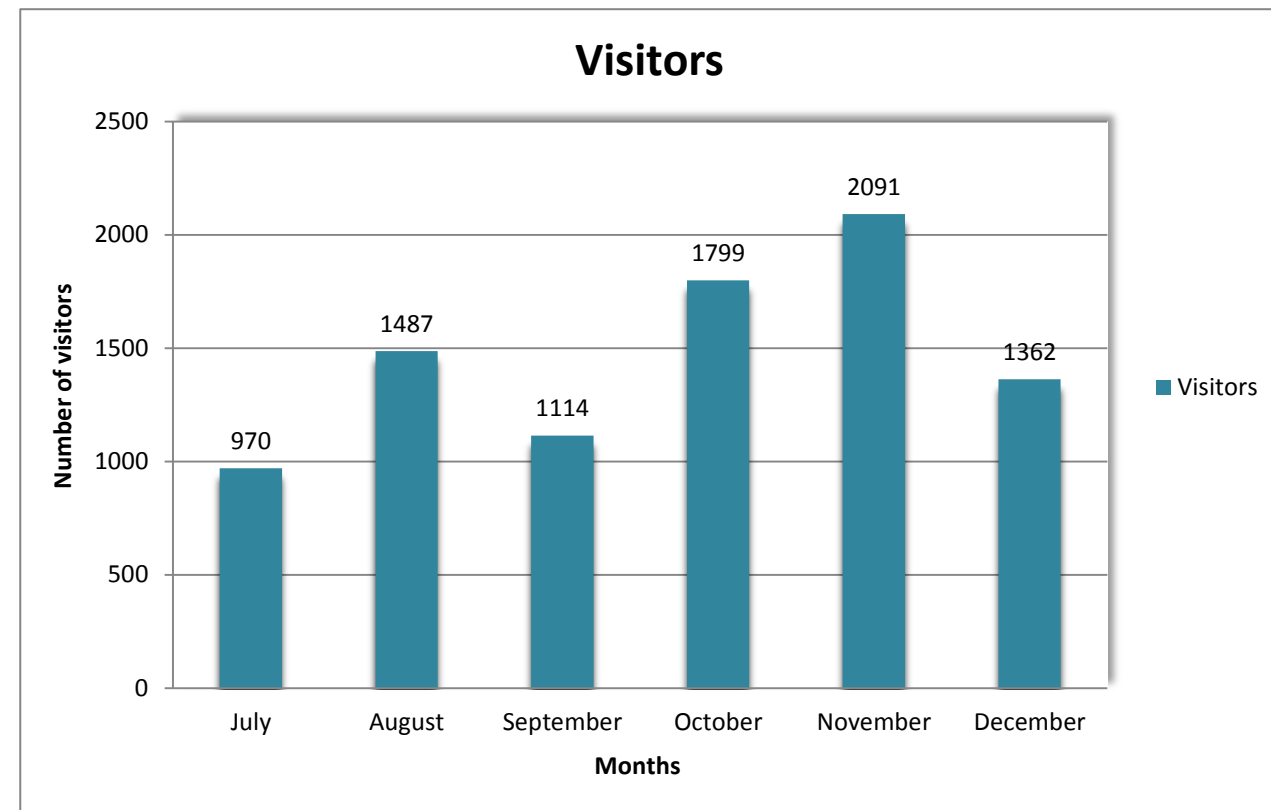




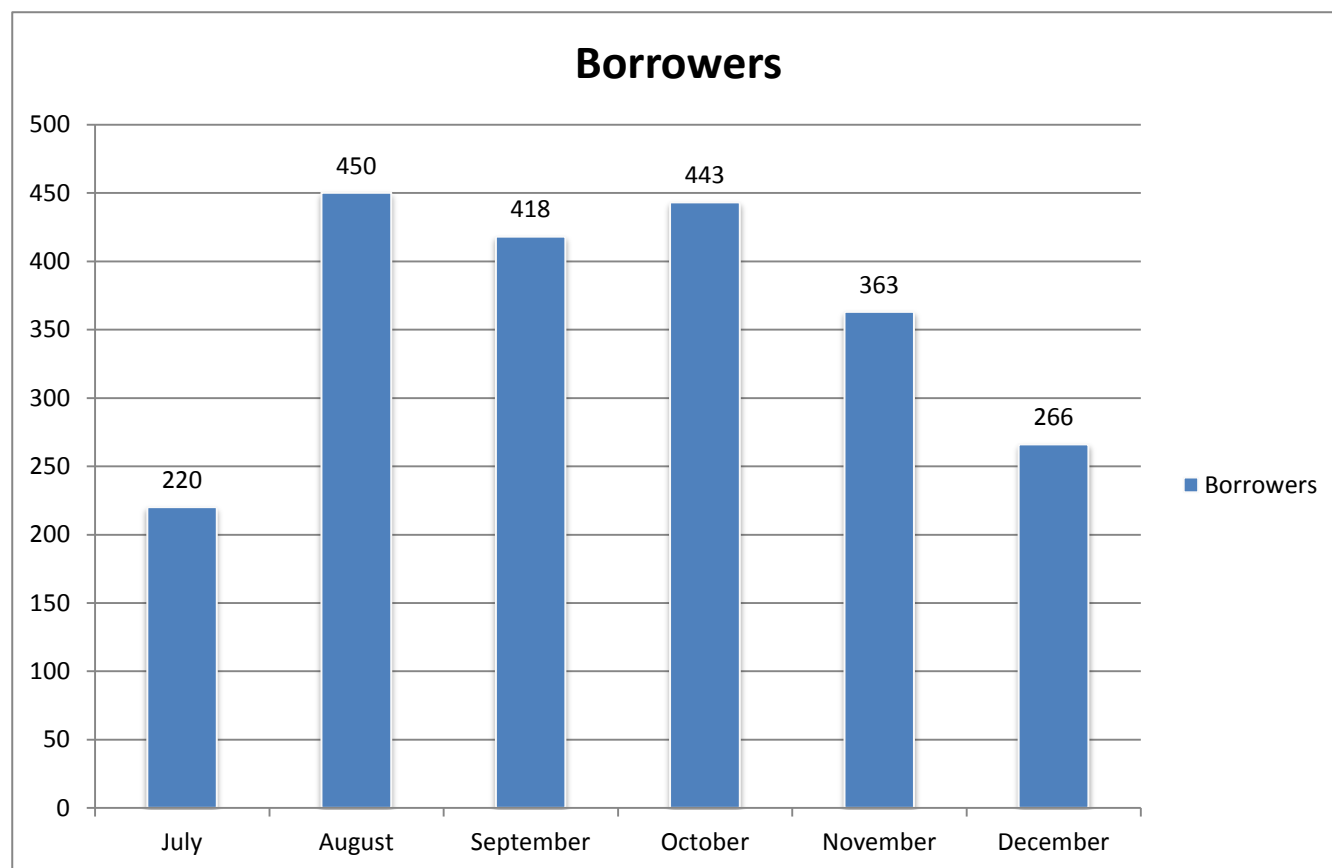
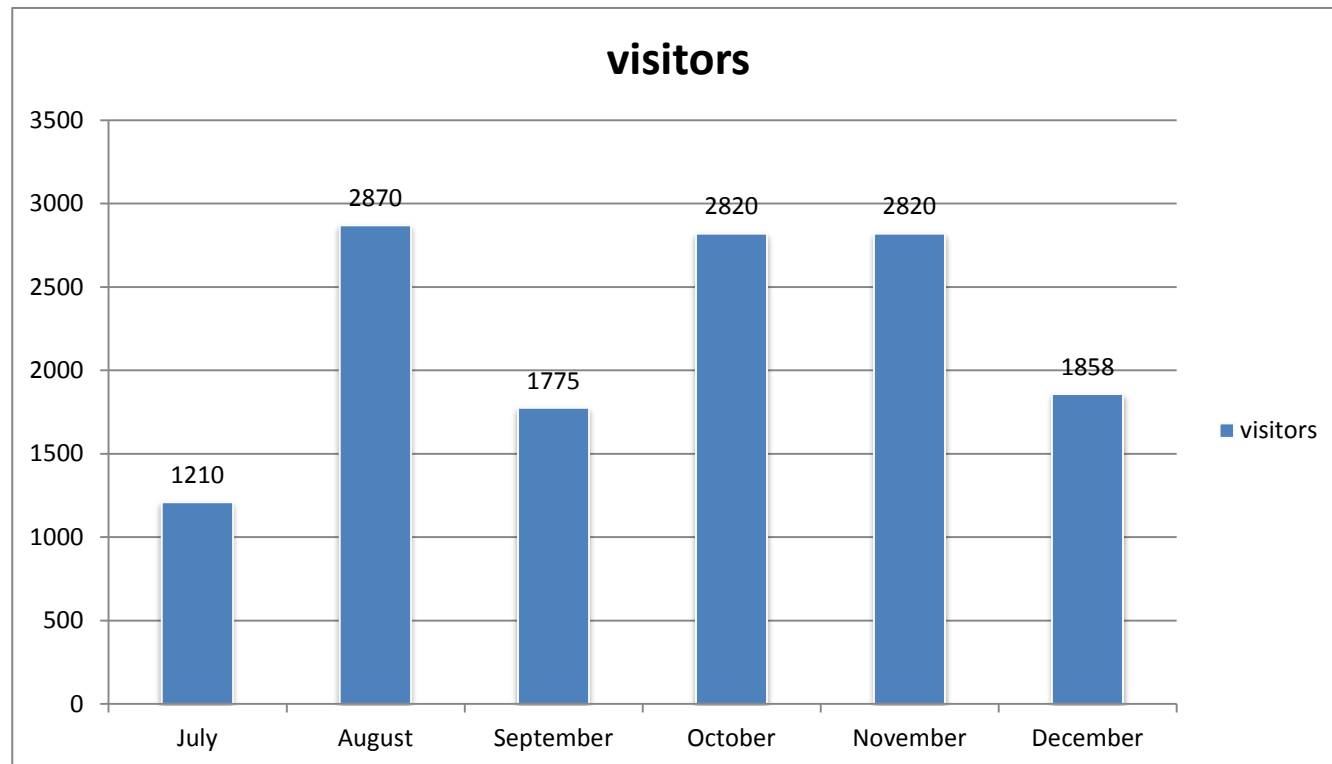
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Blind Date with a Book

Community e-Centre Project: “Empowering Rural Communities– Reaching the Unreached”

Community e-Centre Project: “Empowering rural communities– reaching the unreached” Development fund Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on utilization of Community e-Centres for awareness programs between the Local Government Authority of Maldives, the National Centre for Information Technology and National Library.

The main objective of these sessions was to promote reading in the community. These sessions were conducted at the A. Dh. Hangnaameedhoo Community e-Centre from 06th to 11th August. The sessions contain basic information on how to locate, assess and evaluate the information on the internet. These sessions were conducted in both English and Dhivehi language. Housewives, school leavers, teachers, government workers, and school children from grades 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 participated in the information literacy session.

On the basis of the responses from the evaluation, the workshop has been excellently rated especially with regards to the knowledge and ability of the resource person. Participants have, however, rated lower scores for the ability to apply the knowledge learnt. There were also concerns expressed by a number of participants about the lack of the time duration for each session. They believe they need more time for practice and discussions.
